an Assistant Professor of Graduate Psychology beginning in the 2024-2025 academic year. The position also includes some teaching responsibilities in our undergraduate psychology program. Our department is dedicated to identifying a colleague to support our mission of creating programs defined by a diverse student body and holistic approach to psychology. Moreover, we are looking for a team member who will join in the department's commitment to preparing culturally responsive psychologists and counselors.

Salary and academic rank will be commensurate with qualifications, education, and experience.

Primary Duties and Responsibilities

All Psychology faculty at Alverno College collaborate in curriculum development, teaching, learning, assessment, and program evaluation within Psychology and the curriculum at large. This includes instructional and administrative duties as necessary and assigned. Primary responsibilities include:

- Teach a range of courses in our Master of Science in Community Psychology program and courses at the undergraduate level. The faculty teaching load will require the teaching of theory and clinical supervision courses. Faculty members will also have the opportunity to teach in their interests within the program.
- Advise graduate students.
- Serve and collaborate in departmental and cross-departmental committees.
- Engage in scholarship activities related to teaching and counseling practice.

Qualifications and Education

- Doctoral degree in Psychology, Counselor Education or related Psychology field required.
- Licensed as a Licensed Professional Counselor, Psychologist, or other mental health provider preferred.
- Background check required.
- Strong organizational skills and the ability to professionally communicate with students, faculty and staff.
- Experience and ease with teaching and learning in multiple modalities including in online and hybrid contexts.
- Willingness to learn and apply Alverno's outcomes-based approach to teaching and learning.
