The College also offers a robust array of graduate and degree completion programs for women and men. For more than 130 years, Alverno has been transforming lives with a powerful combination of liberal arts education and career readiness with an innovative and empowering education model of non-graded assessment and abilities-based approach which has been studied by others around the world.

Last year Alverno College welcomed Milwaukee native, <u>Christy Brown, J.D.</u> as its nineth president. President Brown began her tenure during the 2023 – 2024 academic year. Like many Alverno students, Brown was a first generation college student.
